NEW "NORTHERN PASS" SCOPING HEARINGS FOR PUBLIC INPUT

U.S. Department of Energy will be holding a second round of scoping hearings, at four locations from September 23rd -26th. These hearing are required based on the proposal is to place 1,200 megawatt power lines through New Hampshire to bring electricity from Quebec into the New England grid. The first hearings were held in March 2011. Northern Pass has now proposed a new route consisting of 160 miles with eight miles of it being buried in the North Country. The following hearings have been scheduled:

- **In Concord on Monday, Sept. 23, from 6 to 9 p.m. at the Grappone Conference Center, 70 Constitution Ave;**
- **In Plymouth on Tuesday, Sept. 24, from 5 to 8 p.m. in Plymouth, at Plymouth State University, Silver Center for the Arts, Hanaway Theater, 17 High St.;**
- **In Whitefield on Wednesday, Sept. 25, from 5 to 8 p.m. at the Mountain View Grand Resort & Spa, Presidential Room, 101 Mountain View Road, and;**
- **In West Stewartstown on Thursday, Sept. 26, from 5 to 8 p.m. at The Spa Restaurant, 869 Washington St. (this location may change).**

You can register to speak in advance or on the day of the meeting. If you request to speak by September 18th you will be given priority in the speaking order. However, requests to speak may also be made at the Scoping meetings.

Speakers will have 3 minutes each before the DOE panel. Requests to speak or to be added to the mailing list to receive a copy of the draft EIS(Environmental Impact Statement) should be

The New Hampton Conservation Commission will hold a meeting to discuss with the Board of Selectmen and members of the public the proposed trail plan for a recently purchased 8.1 acre parcel of land on the west side of the Snake River, off Waukewan Road, with almost 1500 feet of river frontage. The river flows between Winona Lake and Lake Waukewan. The land is next to an 8.5 acre parcel with about 2800 feet of river frontage that was purchased by the commission in 2010. The Snake River Conservation Area now contains virtually all the land between the railroad tracks and the river, except for the far northern end. The Commission will also have other business on their agenda.
