The history of any community can best be told through the voices of the people that have lived that history. The first "Stories of Our Town" program, held in November, 2013, was a hugely successful storytelling event. The evening whetted local appetites for town history, triggered many memories, and brought the old-timers and newer residents in the audience together with a common trove of local knowledge. This is the Society's second program of the 2014-15 "Our Heritage" series. Seven long-time New Hampton residents will be sharing first-hand knowledge of events that shaped the character of our town. As in November, Coordinators are Pat Hoertdoerfer and Gordon DuBois. Jo Radner, PhD and Project Consultant, New Hampton Humanities Council, included the following in her glowing report of the first "Stories" program: "Familiar with the stories the tellers had shared in their individual interviews, Pat and Gordon
